\$30 Registration Fee

All attendees must register and pay a \$30 registration fee in advance on the CPSA website at www.cpsa.org. Doing so will ensure attendees are expected and receive a name badge to be worn at all convention events. 

2024 WORKSHOPS

Portraits in Colored Pencil with the Master Painter's Touch

hat is it about the Masters' portraits of centuries past that draws us in? The glow of the skin, and the luscious application of the oils? By learning the classical palette and a master oil painter's layering technique, participants will rival the best of 19th and 20th century portraiture with their very own colored pencils.

We will actually mix our own portraiture color wheel with paint. This is the best way to understand the color make-up of the pencils you are using. And it will take away the guesswork and randomness of color-matching from photos.

Then we will put our color theory to work by copying an old master painting, using a painter's layering technique. We will work on Canson Mi-Teintes paper—which I have found takes the most layers—creating the luminosity you find in oil paintings and real skin. We will draw with Prismacolor Premier pencils. Their lower melting point

gives the most realistic skin and paint-like effect and actually feels like the wax oil-medium Lis was taught to paint with.

So come draw like the masters and learn to paint a portrait with your pencils in a technique I developed over my 40 years of drawing with them. Whatever level you are at with your portraits, you are about to take a giant leap into history that will propel your portraits forward!

ABOUT LIS ZADRAVEC

Lis has had a life-long love affair with portraiture. It is the only art she ever wanted to do. She attended the Corcoran School of Art in Washington, DC, at 10 years old in the adult program as well as later at the college level. She also attended the American University and Montgomery College, where she sought out the realist teachers in an 70s/80s world of Expressionists who had been taught by the 60s Abstract artists. She was introduced to a legacy of masters' methods by the dean of painting. During this time, she also earned a cosmetology license and was a model and makeup artist, which lends another aspect to her love of portraying faces. A painter at heart, Lis quickly earned CPX signature status with CPSA for her mixed media portraits. Her award-winning work has been juried into numerous national exhibitions. Among many publications, she also has a chapter in "Draw Portraits in Colored Pencils" published by Ann Kullberg. She is on faculty at the prestigious Yellow Barn Studio in Glen Echo, Maryland, and shows her work at the Eastside Artists' Gallery in Frederick, Maryland.

Scribble Landscapes (Neo Impressionism)

mpressionism is appreciated by every artist and generally enjoyed by all. We are familiar with names like Claude Monet, Camille Pissarro, Berthe Morisot, Alfred Sisley, and Pierre Auguste Renoir. In 1874, Impressionism was considered a radical departure from the mainstream art accepted at the time. Today it is universally loved and found in museums around the world. This workshop will endeavor to bring colored

pencil art into the impressionistic experience of that period. Buckle up colleagues, this will be fun and challenging at the same time.

I have been providing "Mark Making" workshops all over the country for a long time but focused on portraits and still-lives. I always recommended that participants try landscapes with

scribbles and figured it may be an avenue for someone to find their voice. To my surprise, I didn't see any takers and I started to create a few landscapes of my own. It was great fun and I started to identify with how I imagined Sisley felt when he was

developing his pointillism. Color is King and art should be fun.

This workshop will give participants the opportunity to be Neo Impressionists. The artists of 1874 used short brushstrokes or dots; we will create with short groups of scribble lines in random directions. We will develop our landscapes with color and energy. I have found my landscapes to be less stressful and more enjoyable to execute than my other works of art and I feel you will too. Let's start a movement!

ABOUT JOHN SMOLKO

Artist John Smolko had a 35-year career in art education, with the last 25 years of his teaching at Aurora High School in Aurora, Ohio. All of John's art can be traced to his teaching experiences and his scribble style of rendering is a direct result of that teaching. He retired from high school teaching in 2008 and immediately became a full-time artist who exhibits and offers his "Mark Making" workshops all over the country. His unique scribble style is easily recognizable and he has exhibited locally, regionally, nationally, and internationally. John is a signature member of the Colored Pencil Society of America and participates in CPSA conferences and international shows. He is also a member of several CPSA district chapters and continues to share his skills and knowledge with his colleagues. John offers workshops for high school students, most being offered by the Cliffside Artists Collaborative in Hinckley, Ohio.
