

Convention & International Exhibition Guide to Prescott

Prescott offers a delightful climate in July. The temperature during the day is usually in the high 80's. The higher elevation offers cool evenings in the high 50's and an old west vibe. The airport is small with only United Airlines flying into it. However, you can take a shuttle, bus, or rental car for transport from the Phoenix airport to the hotel. It is a one hour and 45-minute drive. Prescott is always bustling with summer visitors and is a nice place for a vacation get-away. Most of the galleries in the town square cater to the tourist crowd. The convention center has all of the appropriate accommodations for our meetings, workshops, and banquets. Prescott is ninety minutes from beautiful Sedona and 50 minutes from Jerome (an old ghost town/artist community).

Sedona

Sedona is world-renowned for its stunning, 1.8-billion-year-old crimson red rock formations and vibrant scenery. Sedona is 70 miles (about 1.5 hour drive) from Prescott via freeway (89A to 260 to 169) or 60 miles via 89A.

Explore beyond Sedona by driving through Cottonwood, Clarkdale, and Jerome.

Jerome

Known as a former, 19th-century copper mining camp turned vibrant, hillside “ghost town” and artist colony, Jerome is about 35 miles of a winding road from Sedona.

A visit to Tuzigoot national monument, Clarksdale, and the ancient ruins of Montezuma Castle and Camp Verde is about 42-45 miles from Prescott.
